## 2. 7:25-44

People's conclusion halfway through the festival:

- Pharisees must have come to believe Jesus's teaching is accurate because they're not arresting him.
- But he can't be the Messiah because we know where He comes from – Nazareth.

Jesus response: 7:28-29 – I am from him and he sent me. – two huge statements!

 from God (Greek shows us) He did not simply mean that God arranged his coming. Illus: Sun beams vs. gift

In the expression "He sent Me," Jesus states clearly that He was the Christ of God, the Anointed One, whom God had sent into the world to accomplish the work of redemption.

Main Point: Jesus is equal to God and He is the promised Messiah.
